Stanislaus County is currently vaccinating all groups identified in Phase 1A of the California Department of Public Health's distribution plan. If you are included in the groups identified in Phase 1A, please contact your employer to see what your options are to get vaccinated.

If getting vaccinated through your employer is not an option, please go to Stanislaus County Public Health's Community Vaccine Clinic to receive your vaccine.

Vaccines are distributed on a First Come-First Serve basis, and no appointment is needed. Please bring a form of identification and proof of employment to verify that you are indeed identified in Phase 1A.

Today, Governor Newsom also provided the exciting update that individuals aged 65 years and over will be added to the groups identified in Phase 1B, Tier 1. Once Stanislaus County completes vaccinations for the groups identified in the current phase (Phase 1A), the groups identified in Phase 1B, Tier 1 will follow. Stanislaus County Public Health, and its network of vaccine providers that receive vaccines directly, are continuously distributing and utilizing allocated vaccines, and request more from the State each week. ## COVID-19 CASES & HOSPITALIZATIONS

COVID-19 cases and hospitalizations continue to increase at an alarming rate in Stanislaus County. Currently, Stanislaus County has 343 people with confirmed COVID-19 being hospitalized, with 81 of those patients requiring intensive care, which is an all time high since the beginning of the pandemic. The region's current ICU availability is 0.0%.

Residents are advised to stay home as much as possible, only leaving the house for essential activities like grocery shopping, and continue the use of precautions like wearing a mask, physical distancing, washing hands, and getting tested.
