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**RESCISSION OF ORDER OF THE HEALTH OFFICER  
OF STANISLAUS COUNTY**

**REQUIRING ALL INDIVIDUALS ENTERING CERTAIN CONGREGATE CARE/LIVING FACILITIES TO TAKE  
CERTAIN PREVENTATIVE MEASURES INCLUDING MASKING AND SYMPTOMS SCREENING TO PROTECT  
RESIDENTS FROM THE SPREAD OF COVID-19**

**REQUIRING EMS PROVIDERS AND FIRST RESPONDERS TO SYMPTOM SCREEN AND WEAR MEDICAL-  
GRADE MASKS WHILE RESPONDING TO CALLS TO CERTAIN CONGREGATE CARE/LIVING FACILITIES  
(CONGREGATE LIVING FACILITIES ORDER)**

**DATE OF RESCISSION: March 10, 2021**

Effective immediately, Congregate Living Facilities Health Officer Order issued May 1, 2020 is rescinded in full in accordance with section 1 of that Order.

Case rates are currently declining in Stanislaus County after an unprecedented surge. Vaccine supply is increasing and healthcare workers and residents in residential care facilities have been prioritized and vaccinated. The Centers for Medicare and Medicaid, the California Department of Public Health, and the California Department of Industrial Relations Division of Occupational Safety and Health (Cal/OSHA) all now have guidance and recommendations in place that supersede this order. In addition, Mountain Valley Emergency Medical Services Agency has a directive for all pre-hospital care service providers to screen at the beginning of each shift.
